To submit questions to Mike Power, email him at Mike@PowerInvesting.net. He will confirm receipt of your question(s) within 24 hours, or email/call him (at 510-366-8836) to rattle his cage. If you submit Q's later, there is insufficient time for the panelist's to research your question. Experience also tells us that early question submission get more "air" time with the panelists, so you more likely to get an accurate and robust answer. Since Monday the 15th is an FTB holiday, our speakers request questions by Friday the 12th, 9 a.m.!

As in previous years, the questions and answers will be transcribed (by Mike Power — thanks, Mike!) and made available to the Chapter.

CSEA REPORT – BOARD MEETING

by Aida Q. Torres, EA, 1st Vice President, Education This is a report on the January 2016 CSEA Board of Director's Meeting, in Old Sacramento on January 9 and 10, which Patty Pringle, EA and I attended. (My first time in this area of Sacramento!)

The first day agenda involved meetings of the different committees:

First was an Executive Committee discussion covering reports, strategy, and an overview of what the Board of Directors Meeting would consider on the second day.

Second , the PIA (Public Information & Awareness) Committee discussed strategic plan objectives, marketing activity, Tax Help Day (see the flyer with this Bulletin and Peggy Hall's summary), Super Bowl 2016 advertising (see the President's Message in this Bulletin for more), and updates on Legislative Affairs, Education, Membership, and the VITA (IRS) Program.

Third, the Education Committee also had a lengthy discussion, covering our Strategic Plan, Subcommittee Reports on speaker's bureau, partnership outreach, and speaker development (discussed in January's EBAEA Bulletin Report)! The focus now is on new business – the 2016 Super Seminar (May 17-19 in Las Vegas and June 1-3 in Reno)! Every member should have received their "Supers" flyer! The Committee also discussed Chapter Promotion of CSEA education events (CSEA Educating America) and the DigiTax series and Pen-to-Paper Event.

Fourth, the Membership Committee conflicted with Education Committee, so I couldn't attend, but the CSEA EVP reported that 302 members have already registered for the Super Seminars! CSEA Members have the \$549 Super Saver Rate until February 29.

Finally, the Finance & Budget Committee Meeting included discussion of funding of Board designated reserve funds, new budget requests, financial statements and variances. These were discussed on the second day as well.

The Board of Directors Meeting took all of the second day. I will focus on membership dues issues that were discussed!

Issue no. 1: A proposed Initiation Fee for new members (\$18) did not pass the BOD, as it serves no important purpose and might be a barrier to membership.

Issue No. 2: It was proposed to eliminate the current dues-sharing practices covering Professional Associates, Renewing and New Professional Affiliates, which in total redirect about \$10,000 to the Chapters annually. This proposal was referred to the Membership Committed for further review and to report on 7-10-2016.

Issue No. 3: The Finance and Budget Committee recommended setting membership dues, as of July 1, 2016, at \$205 for Regular EA Members, \$45 for Members Emeritus, \$45 for Student Members, \$120 for International Enrolled Affiliates, and \$205 for all other mem-

bership categories. There was a motion to lower the renewing member to \$195 rather than \$205 for Regular and "all other" categories, and this was referred to the Membership & Development Committee to work with the Finance and Budget Committee; any changes will be effective 7-1-2016, with no impact on the current fiscal year.

Despite the content-heavy agenda, the meeting adjourned on time!

CHECK YOUR CREDITS!

Now that 2015 is past, check the credits posted to your PTIN at the IRS website to make sure that all of your CE for the year has been properly posted.

The link is:

https://rpr.irs.gov/datamart/mainMenuUSIRS.do

You can also find this page through IRS.gov / For Tax Pros / Register or Renew your PTIN.

If you can't locate your login information, there's a "forgot password /forgot User ID" wizard to help. Do *not* "Create a New PTIN Account". That will create a new PTIN, which you don't want to do.

After logging in, at the very bottom of the window choose "View My Continuing Education Credits." Selecting that link will open a screen which displays the total credits reported for you for 2013, 2014 and 2015. Clicking the "expand" link will display the detail of the credits reported for you.

Remember that there won't be any IRS credit for the amazingly fun and informative California tax panel.

FTB ONLINE ACCESS FOR TAX PROS

I am sure you all know by now that the FTB has a new online Practitioner program. We will have access to a lot more on behalf of our clients.

I was thinking it would all be quite seamless. However, when listening to a Spidell webinar on the system, I see there is going to be stuff we need to do in order to get access to this.

To begin with, we have to ask for a password to be mailed to us. That will arrive within 10 days.

The services we will have available will differ, based on whether we are the tax preparer or the representative (having a POA).

We will gain access to our clients account in a few different ways, either uploading a power of attorney or having the client sign in and give authorization.

For married couples there will be a separate account for each spouse.

The new system will make our contact with the FTB a lot easier. More will be done online, but staffing of the Practitioner Hotline will continue as it has in the past.
